

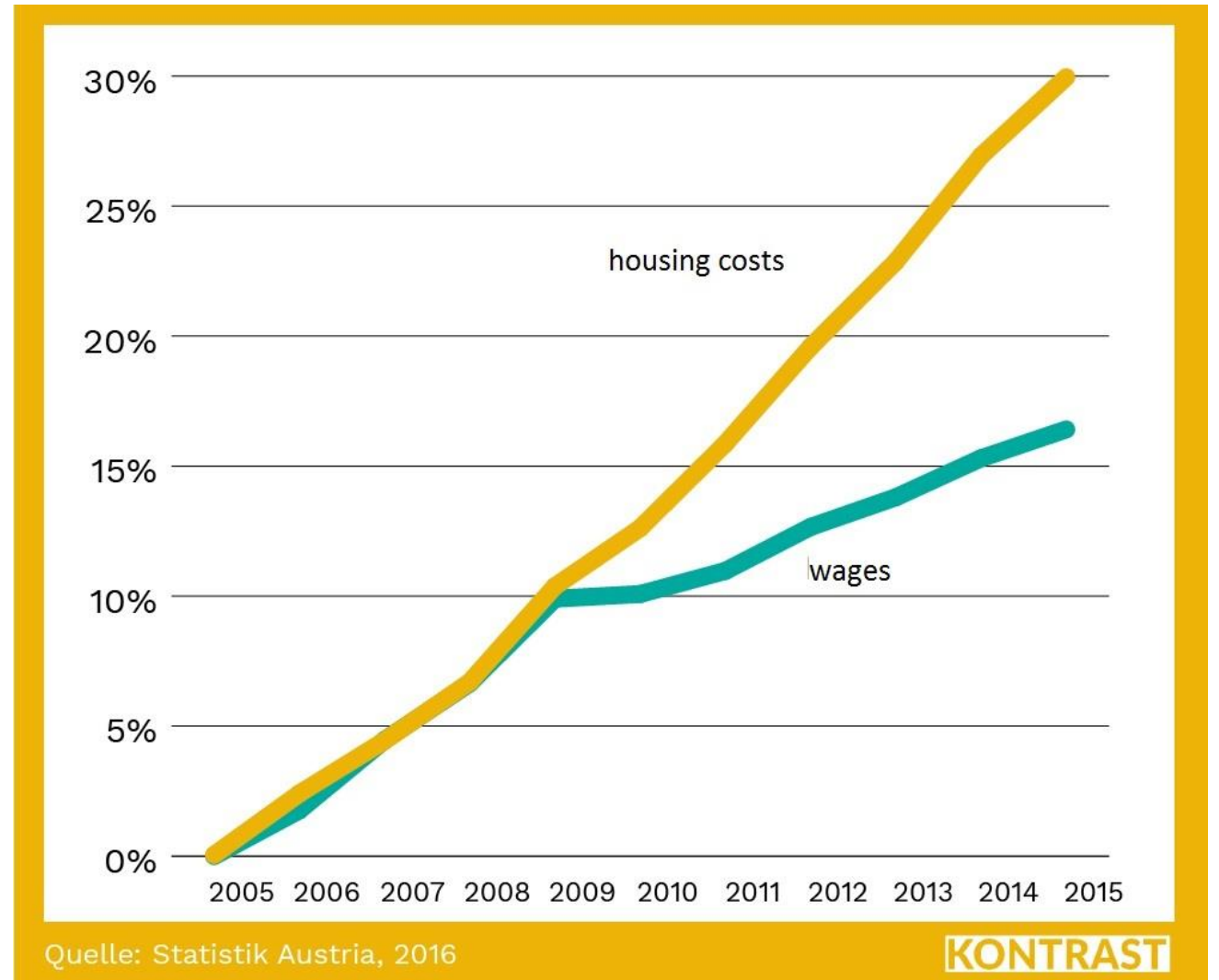

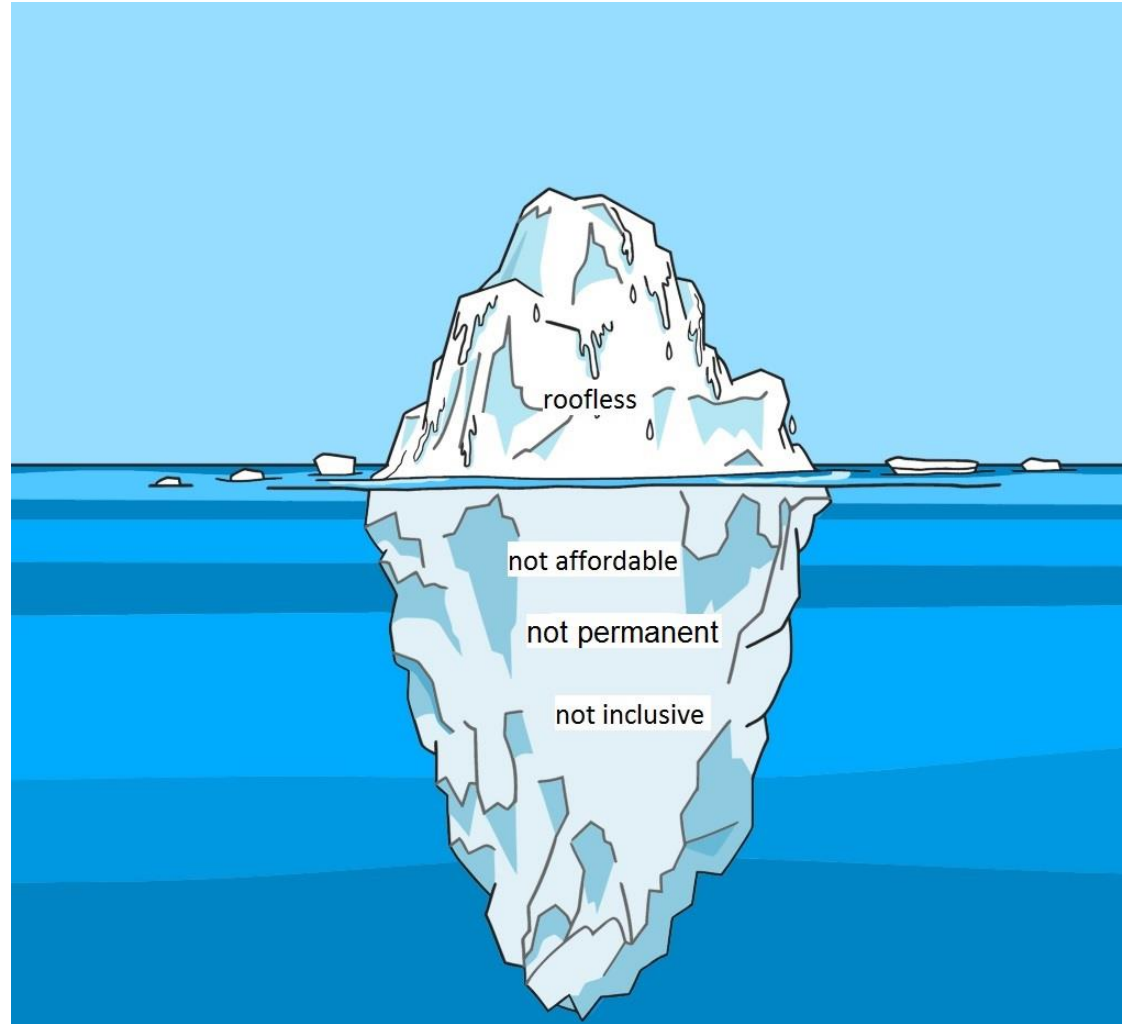

Housing for all. Affordable. Permanent.  
Inclusive.

Affordability = enough money left over to live on after housing costs have been paid

Permanent = a permanent tenancy means that tenants have long-term housing prospects

Inclusive = Inclusion means creating conditions that enable all people to participate in society.

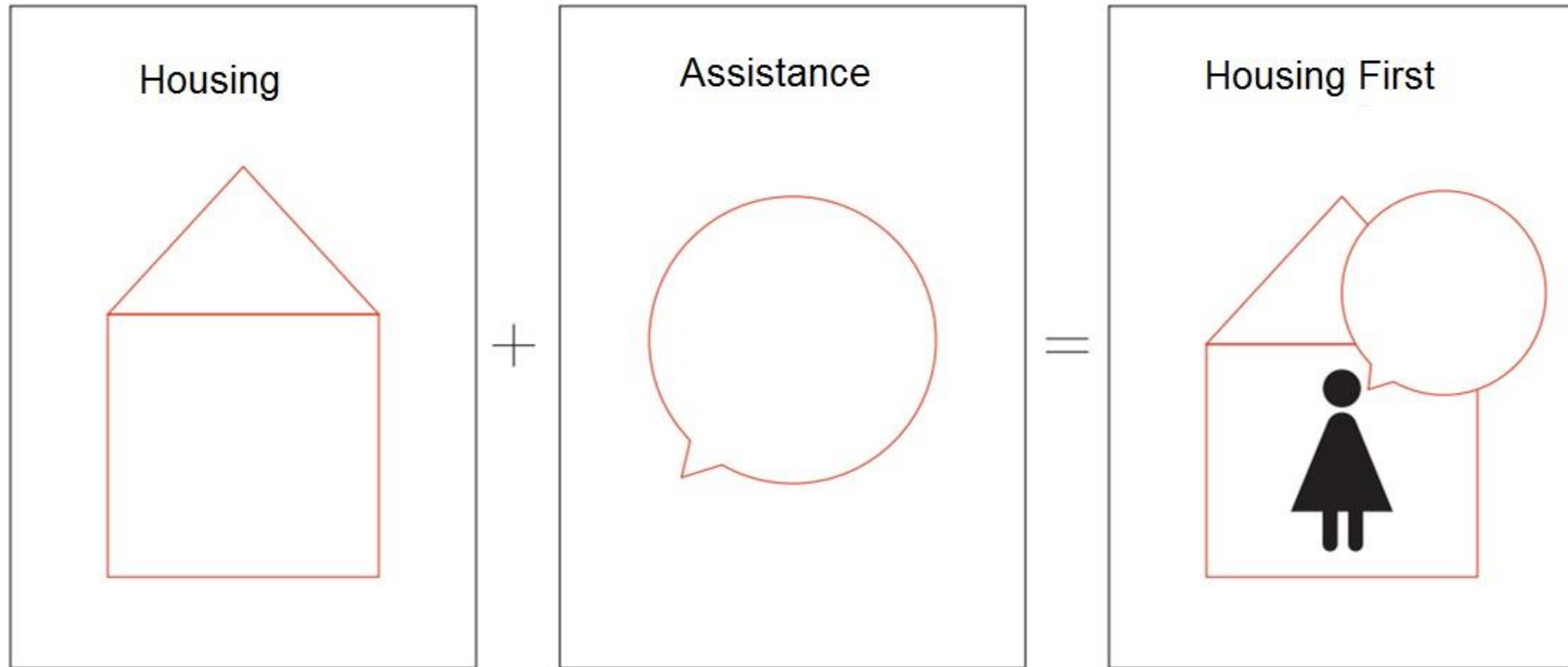
# Vision

The nationwide strategy aims to improve the objective conditions. It is about the interaction of housing and social policy at the federal and state levels. In addition, the interaction between housing developers / landlords and social organizations / support teams is vital to the implementation.

# Measures

## **Federal level:**

Funding for a five-year implementation phase at state level

Establishment of a central competence/coordination centre

Improving the statistics on homelessness

Examination of relevant legal matters in federal competence

## **State level:**

Shared responsibility of housing and social policy

Enable affordable housing and fund it in the long-term

Enable permanent housing and fund it in the long-term

Enable inclusive housing and fund it in the long-term
